FishSec is recruiting an international campaign coordinator and communications expert, initially to lead and support our Return of the cod-project. You will coordinate and support a network of highly qualified fisheries policy experts in our project partner organisations across the Baltic Sea countries.

The challenge: to make EU member states across the Baltic region implement measures, based on the best available science, that help the collapsed Baltic cod stocks to recover. A key milestone if we are to save both the Baltic Sea and it's fishing communities.

- Great communicating skills, experience in producing engaging press releases, web articles, tweets and Facebook posts
- Excellent English, spoken and written - think journalism/copywriting
